
- 1. External Ear = funnels sound into ear

Why do so few listen?


- Listening stigmas
- Listening is valued in kids when young but not when old (everything gets flipped, everything gets turned around, everything gets put upside down).
- Listening is misunderstood
- Listening is often taken for granted.
- Listening is often confused with hearing.
- Listening is viewed as sign of weakness. Yet, listening takes hard-work, practice, and patience.
- Social norms tend to reward expressive skills more than receptive skills.
- Social norms penalize receptive efforts

Anti-Listening Culture


- Traditional Two-Part Listening Training:

















Blue Whale's Heart
